BIOMEDICAL STUDIES PROGRAM

The Biomedical Studies Program (BSP) at St. Luke's Episcopal School offers a dynamic Upper School curriculum designed to augment the college preparatory experience of those students interested in pursuing a career in Medical/Health/Science fields. The BSP is a series of elective courses available to tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grade students. Courses are designed to provide exposure to students interested in pursuing a variety of careers including, but not limited to, Physician, Registered Nurse, Dentist, Veterinarian, Pharmacist, Physicians Assistant, Physical Therapist, Recreational Therapist, Speech Therapist, Psychologist, Epidemiologist, Biomedical Engineer, Health Care Administrator, Sports Medicine, Forensic Science, Dietician, Art Therapist and Medical Librarian.



Classes provide interactive learning opportunities including laboratory and clinical experiences, job-shadowing, guest lectures and presentations. The curriculum for

the BSP includes: Introduction to Bioscience, Medical Mysteries, Health Prevention and Nutrition, Basic Anatomy and Physiology, Basic CPR, First Aid and External Defibrillator Training, Basic EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) Course. The program culminates with a senior project. Students completing the program receive a Certificate of Completion.
