



The Learning Lab

The Learning Lab operates as a classroom and provides support for students with learning differences. Learning specialists, teachers, and counselors closely monitor the student's educational path as they move through each division. Through psycho-educational testing, these learning differences must be identified by a licensed psychometrist or therapist. Only those students with psychoeducational testing on file, along with recommendations from the division directors and teachers, will be admitted into the program.

The purpose of the program is to develop the tools and coping mechanisms necessary for academic success and to encourage independent learners. This is done through consultations, constant communication with teachers, and accommodations. All participants and parents must sign a contract for admission and a participation contract to remain in the program.

Middle School:

The Middle School Learning Lab is a continuing class that meets daily. The student is served both individually and in a group setting.

Upper School School:

The Upper School Learning Lab is set up as a directed study hall which meets daily. Students, work independently, but have staff available to work one-on-one. The Learning Lab teacher serves to help students manage all academic levels.

Accommodations:

Accommodations are identified in the student's psychoeducational test and are only granted through participation in the Learning Lab. **Documentation must be current: within the past three years.** Although there is a wide breadth of recommendations, the accommodations provided will be decided by the Learning Lab Director, Division Directors, Counselor, teachers, and parents.

Cost:

The cost of the program is \$500.00 per semester.

Oral testing fee: \$15.00
