Panel 1: Vocabulary: As you read your book, look up words you do not know. List five new words alphabetically and their definitions.

Panel 2: Summary: Write a two or three paragraph summary of the book that highlights the beginning, middle, and end of the book.

Panel 3: Opinion: Write your response to the book. It will be your review of the book. It should include your rating (1-10) of the book and why.

Panel 4: Front Cover: This is the front cover. In this section, you need the title, author's name, your name, date, and an illustration.

Panel 5: Characters: List the characters in the book and write a brief description of each one.
